

Directions to and From Ronald McDonald House and Seattle Children's



- It is a 5- to 10-minute walk.
- We suggest only walking in daylight.
- Umbrellas are available, if needed.
- Feel free to use a wagon to transport your child. They can be found at hospital entrances, or ask a greeter for help.
- Shuttle service is offered:
 - Call 987-RIDE (987-7433).
 - Reserve in advance, if possible.
 - The shuttle van is wheelchair accessible.
 - Car and booster seats are provided, if needed.
 - Be sure to tell us if you need one.

From Ronald McDonald House to Children's:

- From building A, B or C – Turn left on 40th Ave. N.E.
- Turn left on N.E. 50th Street.
- Make a slight right on 41st Ave. N.E.
- Walk across the street to Children's.

From Children's to Ronald McDonald House:

- At the bottom of Children's driveway – cross the street.
- Take a slight right onto 41st Ave. N.E.
- Turn left on N.E. 50th Street.
- Turn right on 40th Ave. N.E.
- Building C is at 5000 40th Ave. N.E., on your right.
- Buildings A and B are at 5130 40th Ave. N.E., on your right.

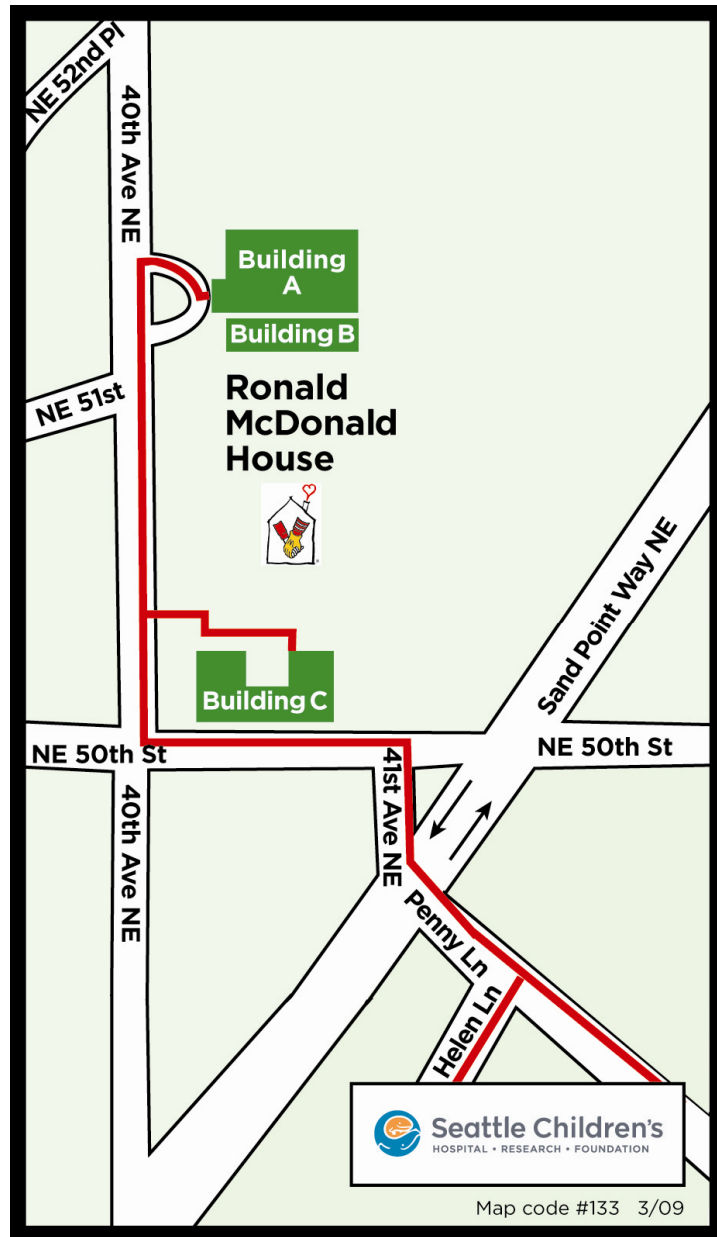
