



POSTGRADUATE YEAR ONE (PGY1) PHARMACY RESIDENCY

Program Objectives

Pharmacists successfully completing this one-year pharmacy practice residency will be able to:

- Manage and improve the medication-use process
- Provide evidence-based, patient-centered medication therapy management with interdisciplinary teams
- Exercise leadership and practice management skills
- Demonstrate project management skills
- Provide medication and practice-related education and training
- Utilize medical informatics effectively

Program Description

The Postgraduate Year One Pharmacy Residency at Children’s Hospital and Regional Medical Center is a one-year training program that offers an environment to gain professional competence, expand clinical knowledge, and develop a philosophy of pharmacy practice. Children’s Hospital and Regional Medical Center has 250 licensed beds, over 12,000 annual inpatient admissions, and more than 160,000 ambulatory visits in 2006. The resident will practice in a variety of acute care settings. Opportunities to explore additional areas of interest are available through electives both on and off site. In addition to clinical services, the resident will serve as a preceptor to pharmacy students completing their clinical clerkships.

Pharmacy Practice Residency Requirements

- Complete and present a research project at the Western States Conference
- Participate in teaching activities with students
- Prepare and present drug monographs for the Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee
- Complete parenteral nutrition competency
- Staff 16-24 hours per month on average (primarily on weekends and holidays).

Stipends and Benefits

Residents receive an annual stipend of \$42,640 with full benefits including an excellent healthcare benefit package, 10 days of vacation leave, and 5 days of sick leave.

In addition, residents receive educational leave and a stipend to attend and participate at various pharmacy conferences, including the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting in December, and the Western States Residency/Preceptor Meeting in May, in Asilomar, California.

Qualifications of the Applicant

Selected applicants will be required to visit Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center for an on-site interview in January or February. The applicant must meet the following general requirements:

- Pharm.D. degree from an ACPE-accredited College or School of Pharmacy OR equivalent experience.
- Licensed or eligible for licensure in the State of Washington. Must obtain pharmacist license by September 1, 2007. (<https://fortress.wa.gov/doh/hpqa1/HPS4/Pharmacy/default.htm>).
- Participate in the ASHP Pharmacy Resident Matching Program (<http://www.natmatch.com/ashprmp>). Program code number: 122413
