

## Nephrotic Syndrome

Proteinuria, low serum albumin edema, elevated cholesterol

### What can you do?

We prefer that all cases of nephrotic syndrome be referred prior to treatment. We try to see all referrals for new cases of nephrotic syndrome within 24 hours. In some cases, however, treatment may need to be initiated before we can see the patient.

### What can you send? (please fax to 206-985-3121)

- Relevant chart notes, including growth charts and vaccination records
- Blood pressure readings
- All labs you have obtained, especially urine results

- Talk with your patient and family about the reason for the referral and the questions to be answered.
