

WHO	Should be referred to the Speech and Language Clinic?	We see patients ages birth to 18 for evaluation of the following conditions: receptive and expressive language disorders, articulation and phonologic disorders, voice disorders, motor speech disorders (such as apraxia), fluency (stuttering) disorders, speech disorders associated with cleft palate or craniofacial differences, feeding and swallowing disorders, autism spectrum and social communication disorders, velopharyngeal dysfunction, paradoxical vocal fold dysfunction, cognitive communication disorders, and augmentative/alternative communication (AAC) assessments.
WHAT	Work-up is needed prior to the first appointment?	No pre-referral work-up is required for most conditions. If you have already done a work-up, please fax your information to 206-985-3121.
WHEN	Will my patient be able to obtain an appointment?	Coming soon - appointment wait times for all clinics.
