

Krysta Barton Shutske, PhD, MPH

Dr. Shutske is a Research Associate with the Treuman Katz Center for Pediatric Bioethics at Seattle Children’s Hospital. She earned her PhD in Public Health Genetics at the University of Washington while working as a research assistant at the Center for Genomics and Healthcare Equality. Her dissertation focused on “Genetic testing for Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD): Evaluating the challenges of genomic translation.”

Dr. Shutske conducts qualitative research on a variety of ethical issues. Recent projects that she is involved in include “Family Experiences with Genetic Testing and Return of Results” and “The Benefits and Burdens of Cancer: a prospective, longitudinal cohort study of Adolescents and Young Adults.” Her current research projects include gaining perspectives of Native Communities regarding Genomics, exploring spirituality and religiosity during the adolescent cancer experience, and exploring the experience of adolescent young adults with advanced cancer and those who care for them.
