

DISCLOSURE TRACKING FOR RESEARCH

Background

Under the Federal Privacy Rule (HIPAA), patients and their legal representatives have the right to obtain an accounting of how their protected health information (PHI) has been disclosed without their authorization for certain purposes, including disclosures for research. In order to provide a complete accounting upon request, **Seattle Children's must track all such disclosures of PHI.**

When are researchers required to Track Disclosures?

Children's IRB determines if tracking is necessary as part of the review and approval process for each research study. The IRB will inform the principal investigator in writing if tracking is required in the approval documents it provides for each research study. Generally speaking, tracking will be required when the IRB approves a waiver of HIPAA authorization and at least one member of the research team is not part of Children's workforce. Employees of Seattle Children's, Children's University Medical Group (CUMG) faculty, and residents and fellows working at Children's are members of the workforce. Students other than residents and fellows usually are not.
