



## Nursing Publication Support Grant Program Overview

### PURPOSE

---

The purpose of the Nursing Publication Support Grant is to promote the submission of scholarly work for publication. Grants are intended for Seattle Children's Hospital nurses who have a completed QI, EBP, Research, or other scholarly work and are ready to publish the findings. **The nurse researcher and others experienced in publishing are available to provide mentorship support.**

### AWARD DETAILS

---

#### A. Funding

- Financial support is awarded to clinical nurses, though all nurses may participate in the program, with mentor support. Awardees will receive an initial \$500 grant to prepare the first "rough" draft of a manuscript. Up to \$1000 additional support may be awarded, if the recipient delivers content that is approved by the nurse researcher.
- Recipients will receive up to a total of \$1500 in grant funding to support the time required to prepare and submit a manuscript. The grant is not expected to cover the full time effort required. Recipients should consider the additional time commitment as a personal professional activity.
- Mentorship support is available to all nurses and provided by the program's Nurse Researcher (or designee). There is no limit to the amount of mentorship support (except as limited by the mentor's schedule and publication support grant budget). Awardees may meet with the mentor within funded time from the grant or outside of that time.
- Up to six projects are expected to be funded annually.

#### B. Eligibility

- Applicants must be a Seattle Children's Hospital nurse, working in any areas of the hospital including inpatient, ambulatory, and regional clinics. Clinical nurses (direct care staff), leadership, and advanced practice nurses are eligible to apply.
- Projects that will be published must already be completed.
- Projects that have already been presented as an abstract, poster, or podium presentation will take priority.
- Applicants must be in good standing within their department.
- Applicants must seek approval from their director (signature required).
- Applicants must work with the nurse researcher. They may work with other colleagues and mentors as well, but the nurse researcher will oversee the process and review the draft manuscript prior to submission.
- Applicants should expect to complete and submit the manuscript within 6 months of receiving funding.

### C. Allowable Costs

- Author salary time while writing the manuscript, submitting, meeting with the nurse researcher, and/or mentor (clinical nurses only).

## APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS

---

Applications will be reviewed by members of the Nursing Research Steering Committee. Applicants who are not funded are encouraged to schedule an appointment with the nurse researcher to strengthen the application for future re-submission.

## AWARD TERMS & CONDITIONS

---

- A. Seattle Children's Nursing Publication Support Grant will issue an award of up to \$1500 to support writing time.
- B. It is expected that the manuscript will be prepared and submitted within the timeline approved between the grant recipient and nurse researcher.
- C. The recipient must regularly check in with the nurse researcher as defined by the nurse researcher.
- D. No-cost extensions require the approval of the Nursing Research Steering Committee. All requests for a no-cost extension should be submitted to the nursing research inbox no less than 30 days prior to the project end date. Only one no-cost extension will be issued and the funds must be expended within 6 months of the no-cost extension approval.
- E. The Recipient must ensure that, before the manuscript is submitted for publication, IRB requirements have been met, it has been reviewed and approved by the nurse researcher, and others as necessary. The nurse researcher will work with the Associate Chief Nurse for Practice and Research to determine any additional approvals that may be needed
- F. Author(s) must comply with author guidelines and disclosers as outlined by the journal for publication. Where the terms and conditions of the Award have not been observed, the nursing research program reserves the right to withdraw the remainder of the Award.
- G. At the conclusion of the project, the completed manuscript must be submitted to the nurse researcher.
- H. The manuscript will be listed on the nursing research website
