

Equipment Checklist for Travel

Be sure to have the following items with you at all times when traveling. Call Home Care Services 2 to 4 weeks before you leave for help with your equipment needs.

Please note that Home Care Services does not arrange international delivery and services for oxygen or respiratory equipment.

Necessary equipment:

- Your prescriptions* and medical insurance cards
 - Portable suction machine, canister, tubing
 - Suction catheters and saline
 - Resuscitator bag
 - Oxygen
 - Trach tube of the same size and one smaller
 - Sterile lubricant
 - Spare trach ties
 - Oximeter, cable, case, extra probes
 - External battery, inverter cable, pigtails (if required)
 - Extra fuses for power cables or pigtails
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*Always carry your child's prescriptions for medicine, oxygen and respiratory equipment. You will need them at ticket counters and pharmacies or home care agencies at your destination. Call us with any questions or concerns you have about traveling with your child.
